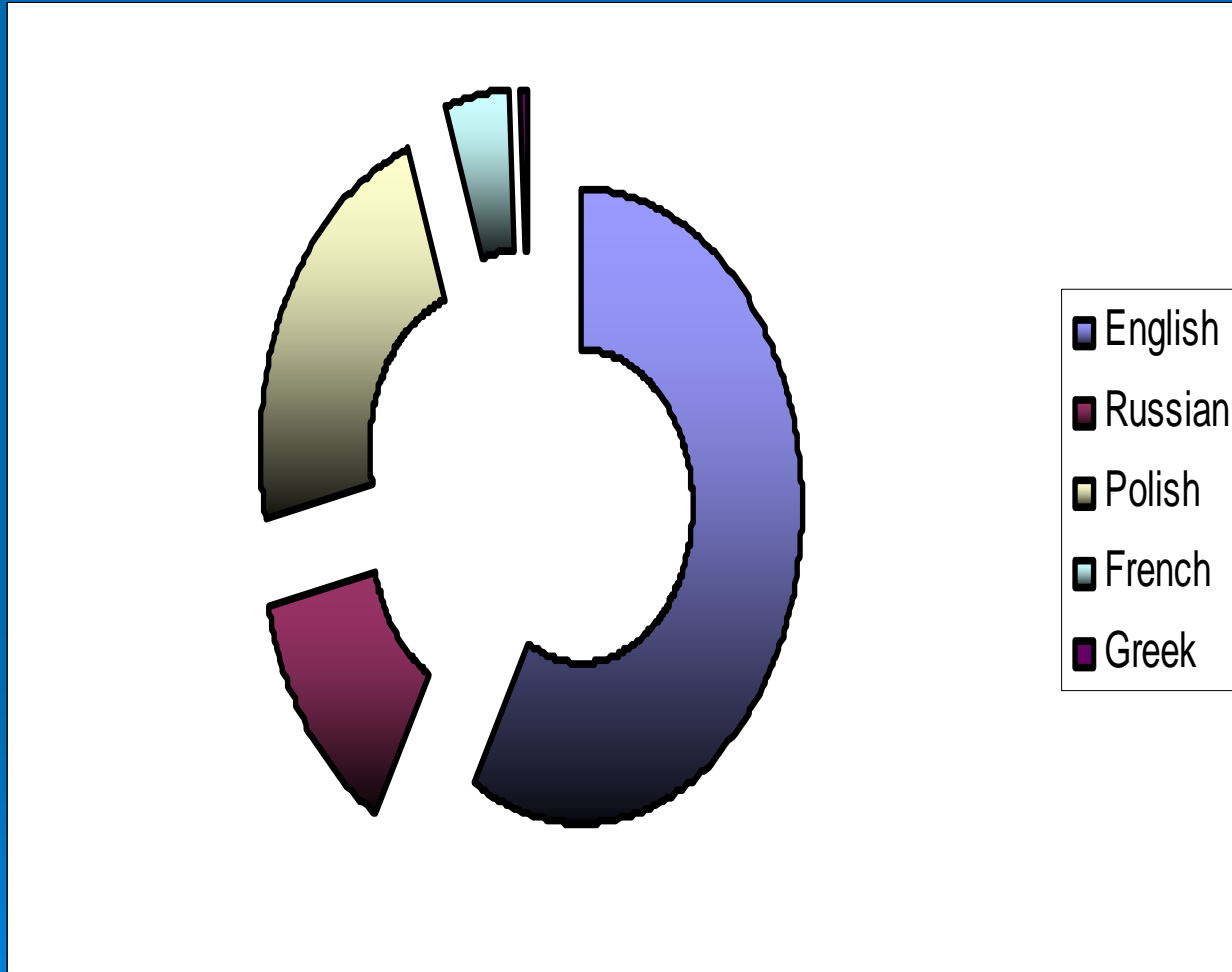

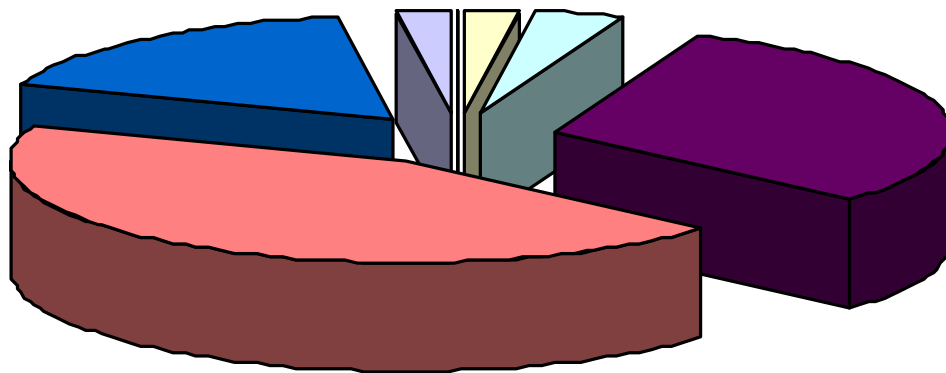

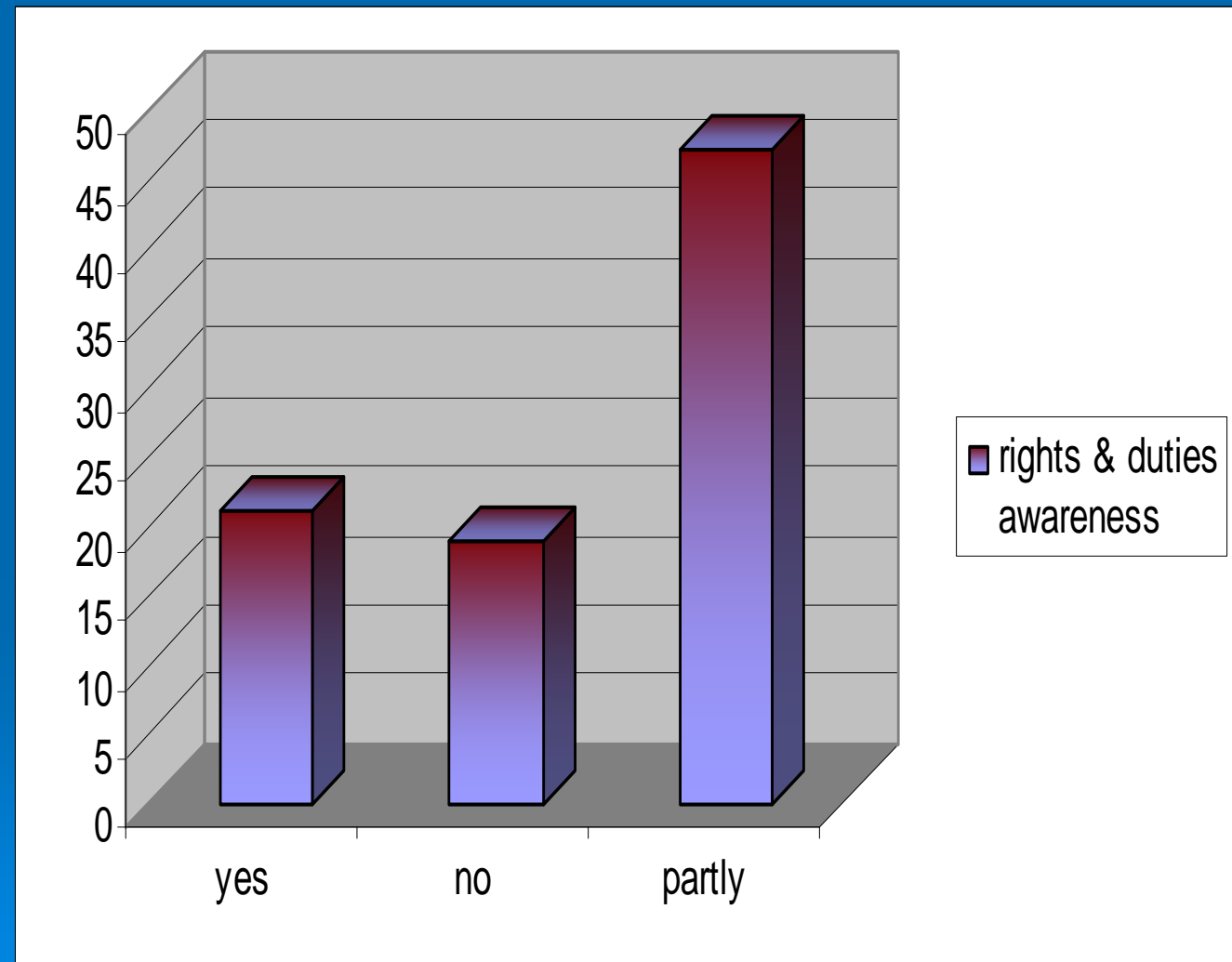

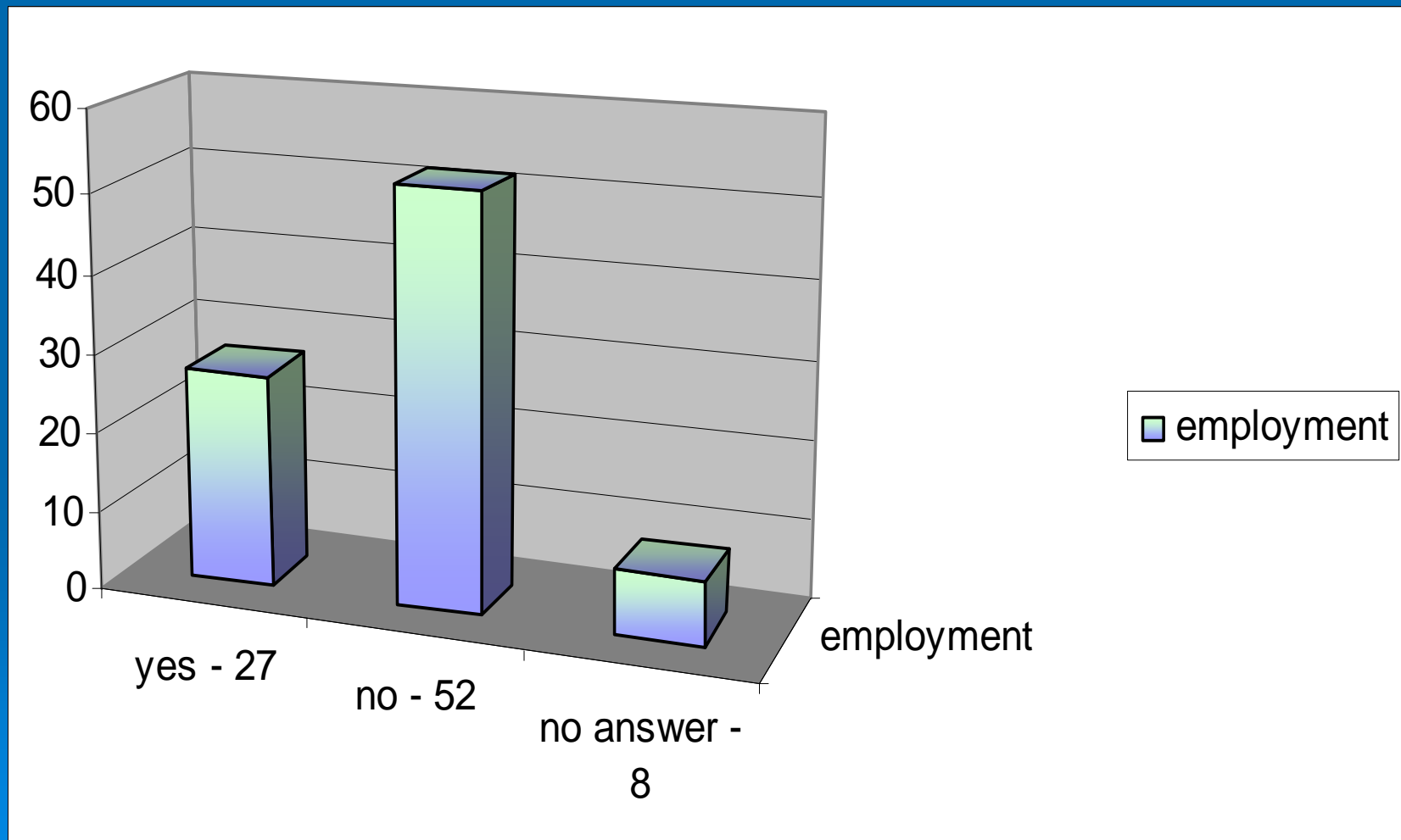

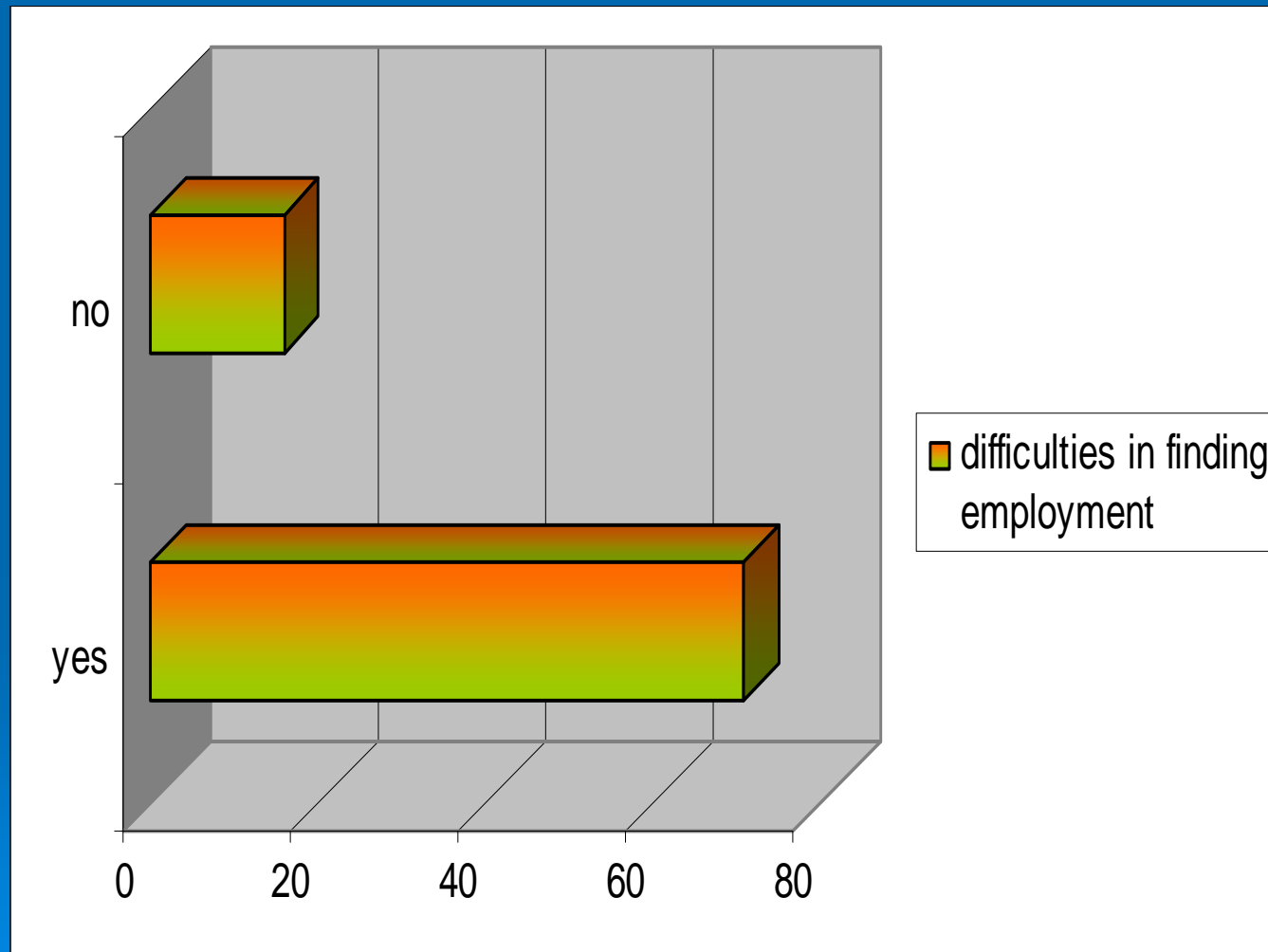

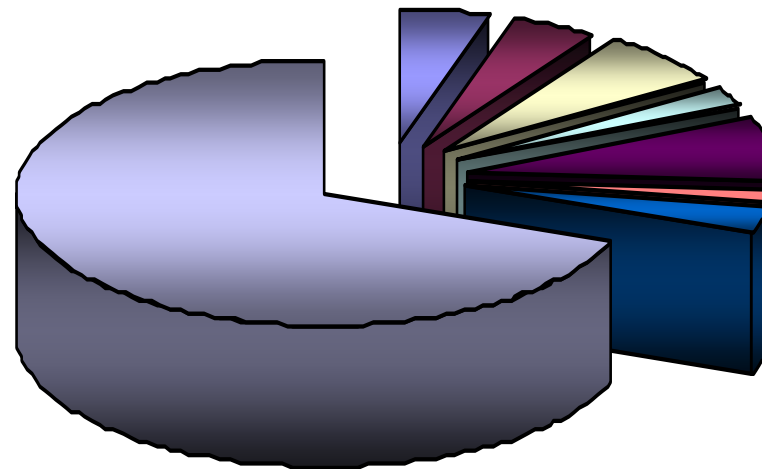

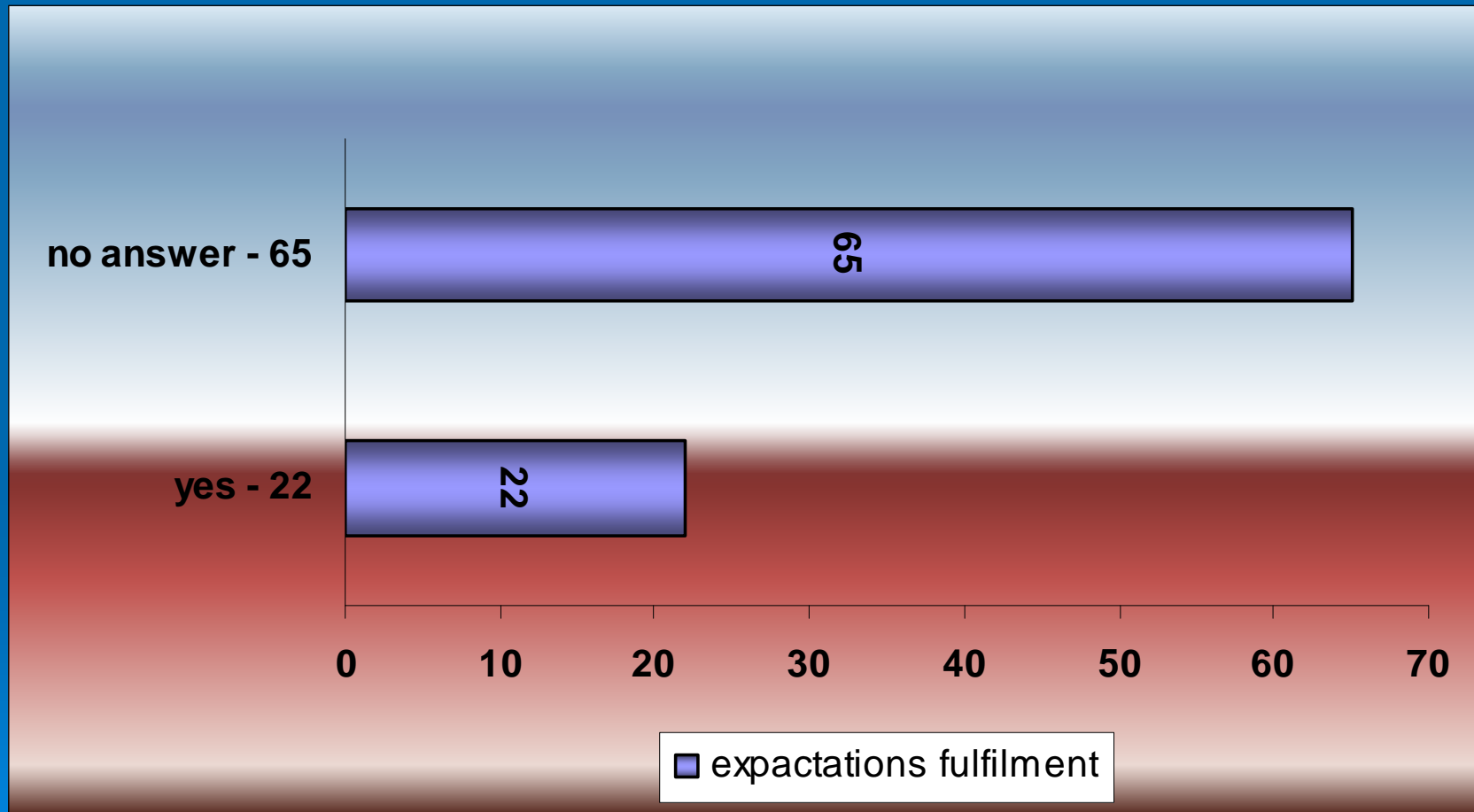

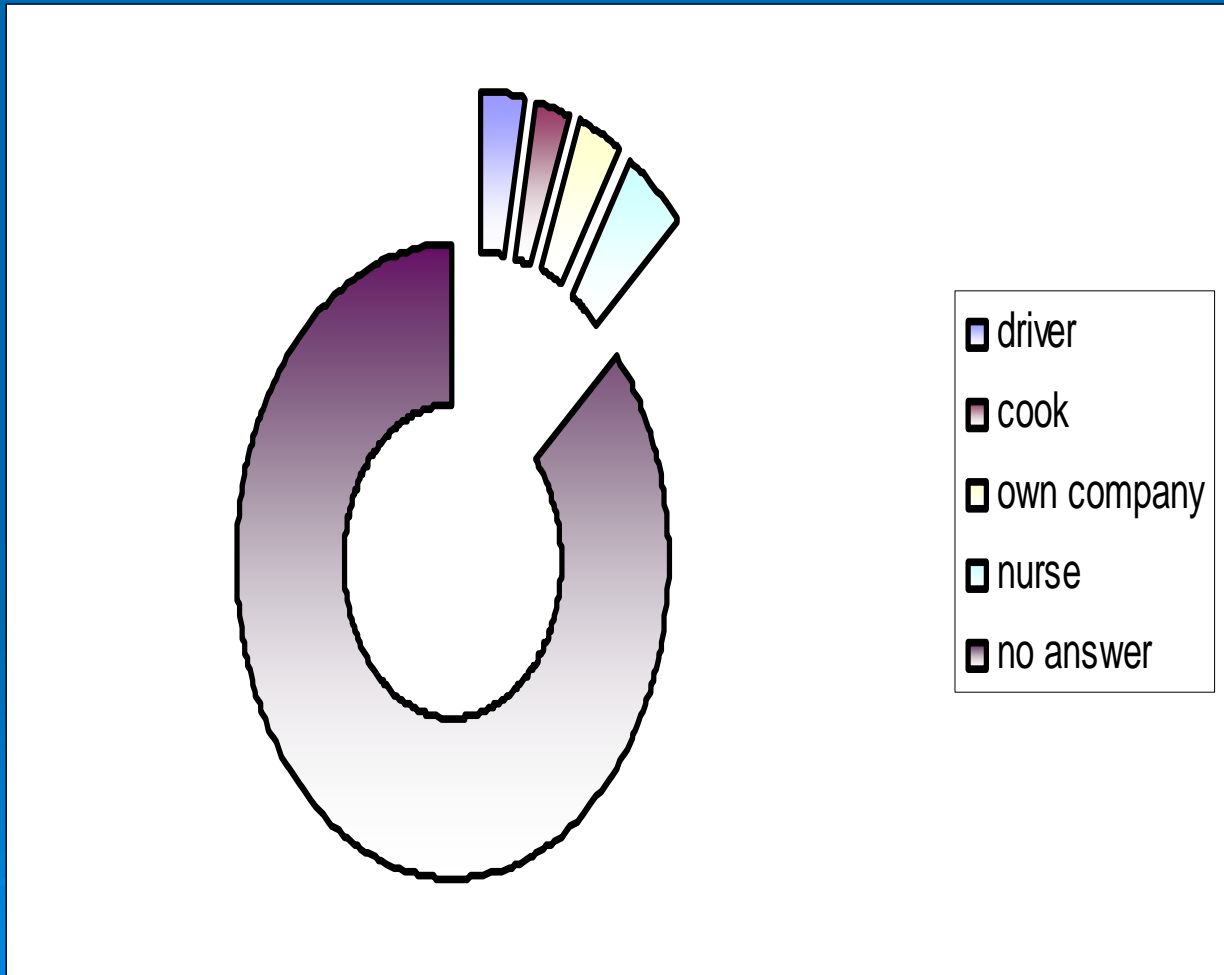

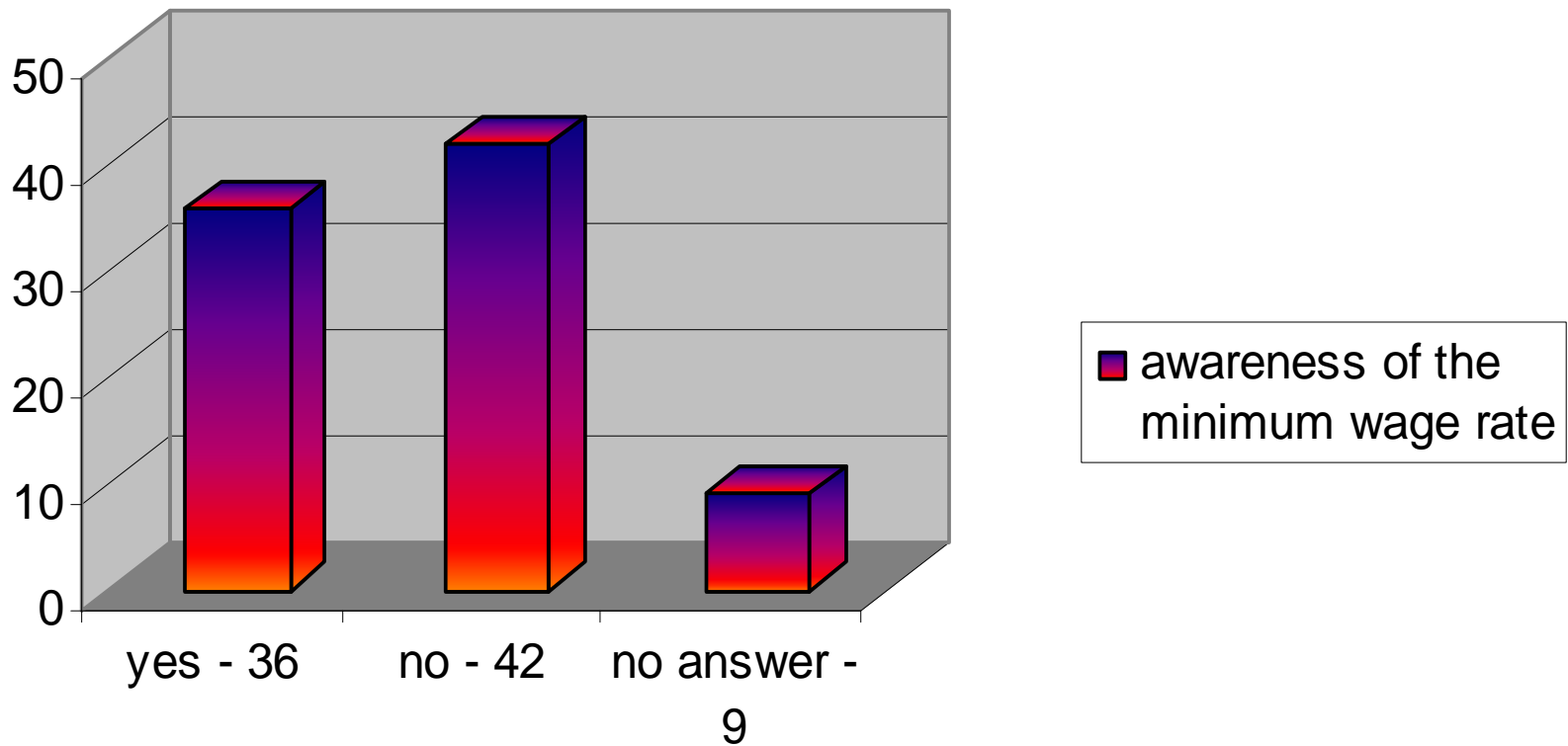

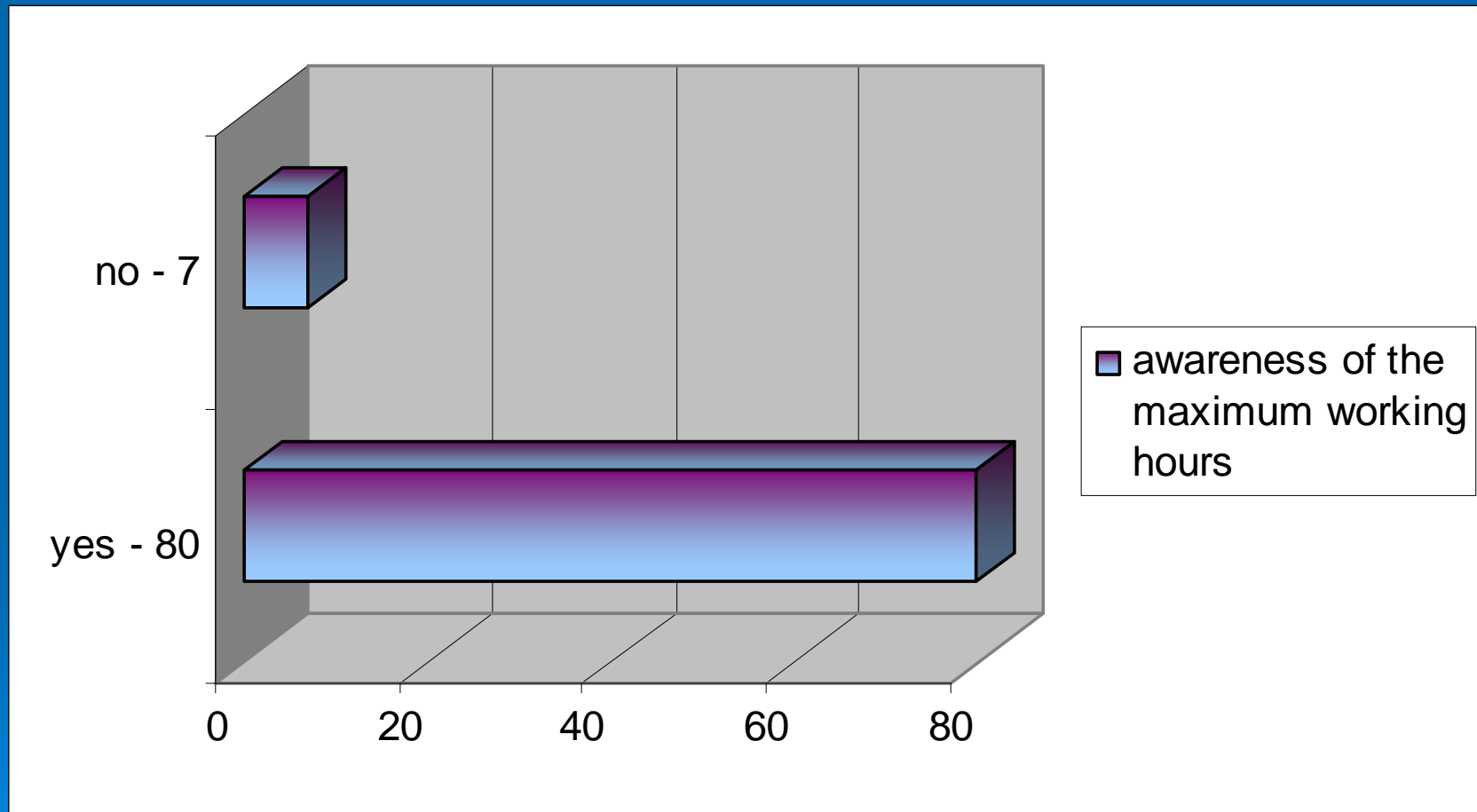

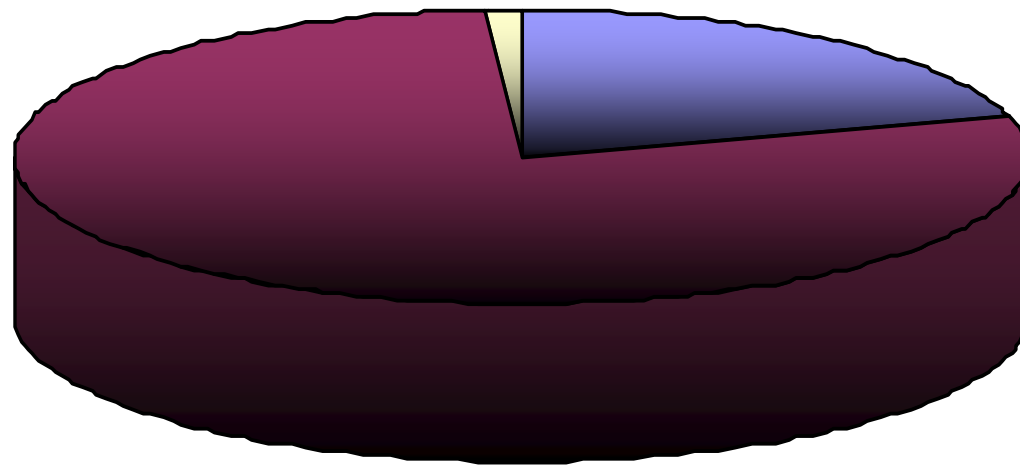
# Awareness of the minimum wage rate

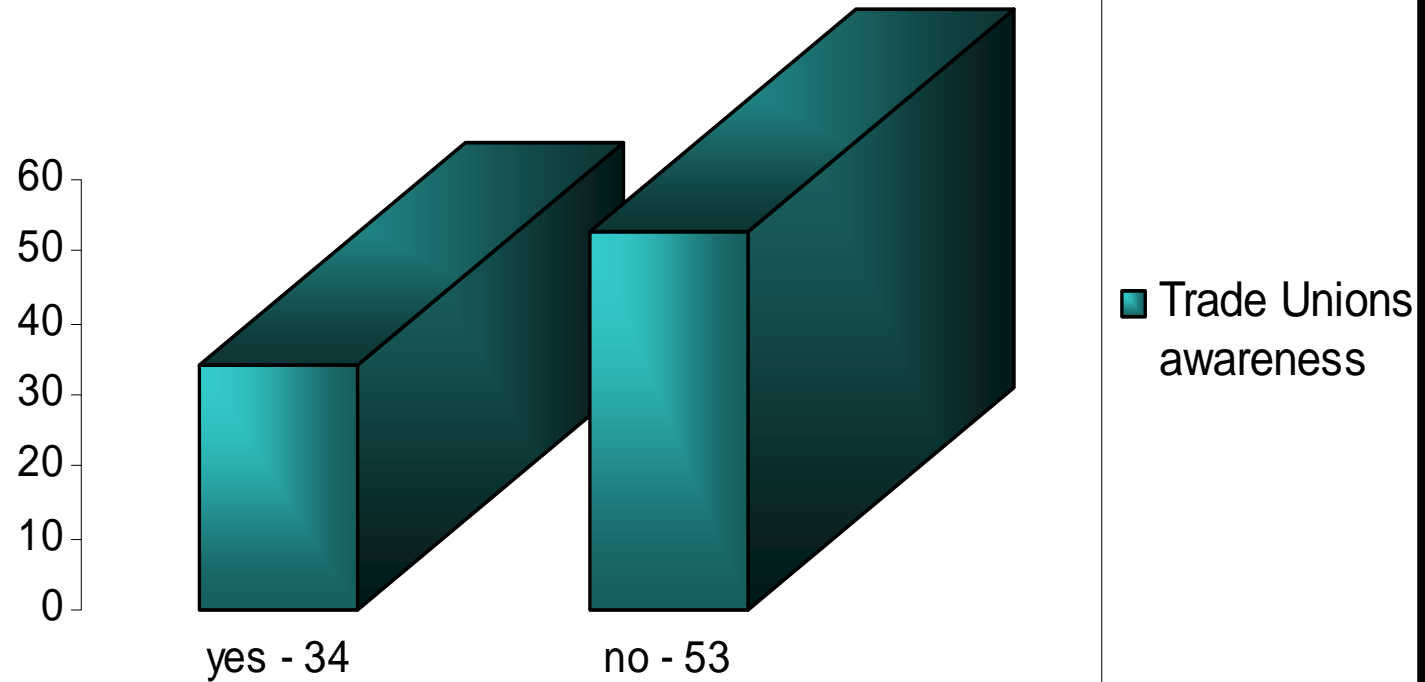

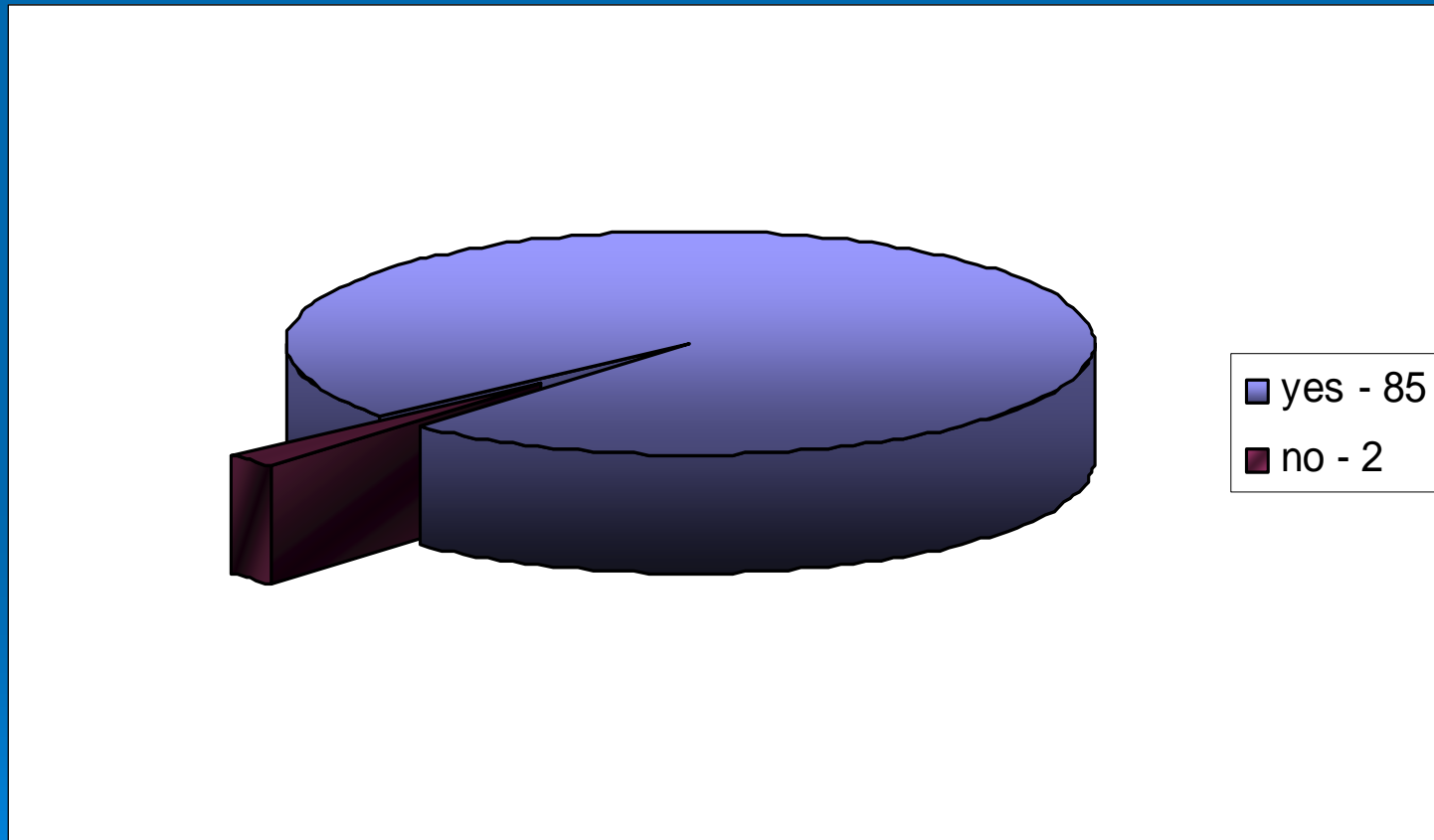

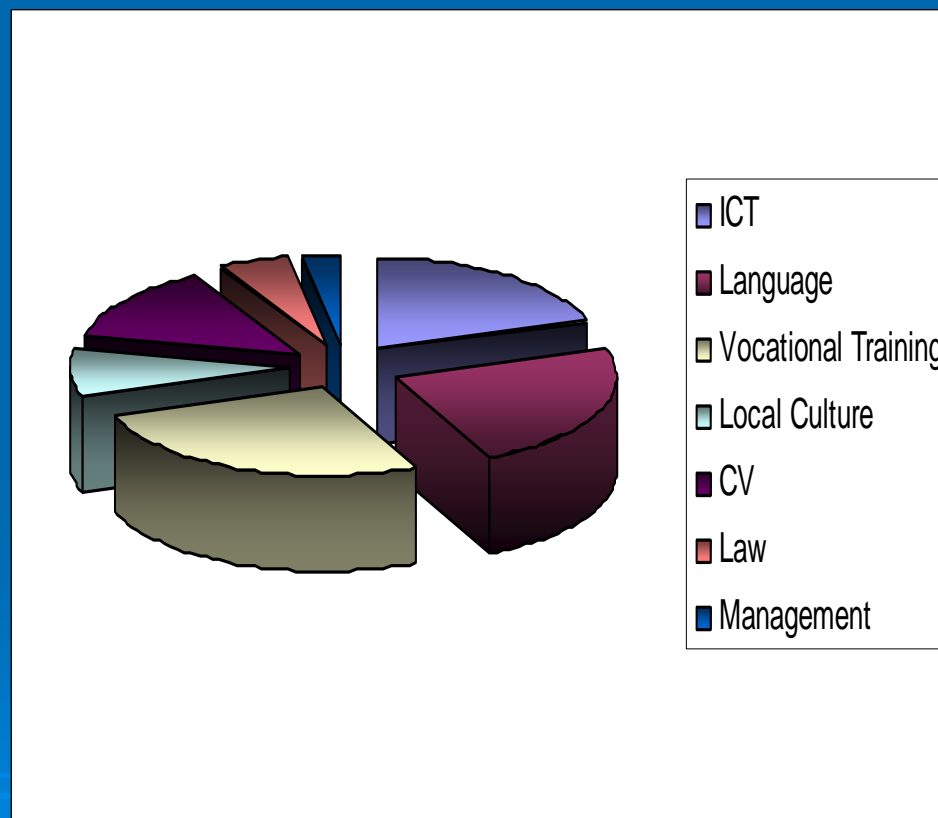

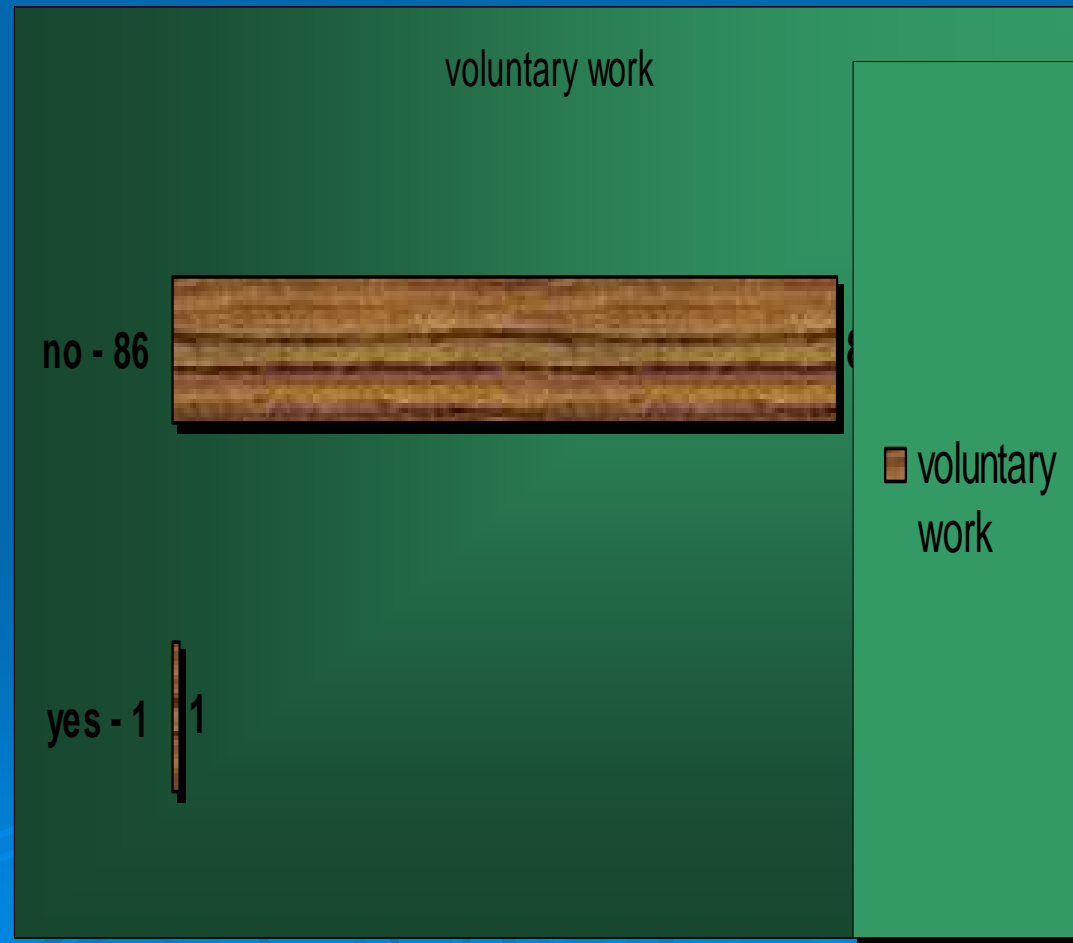

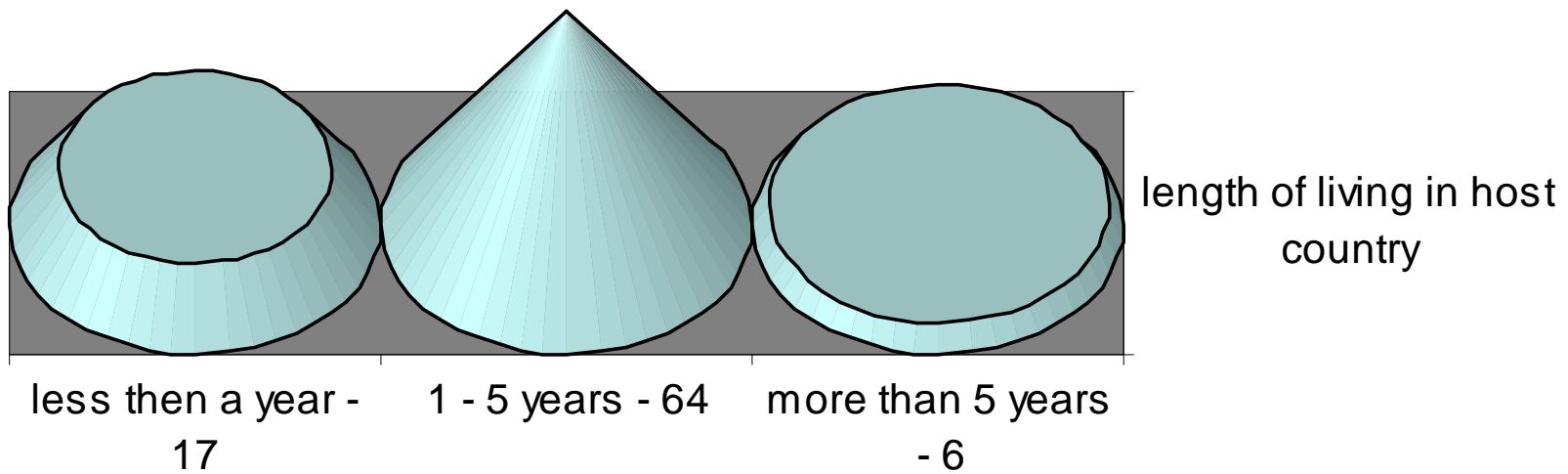

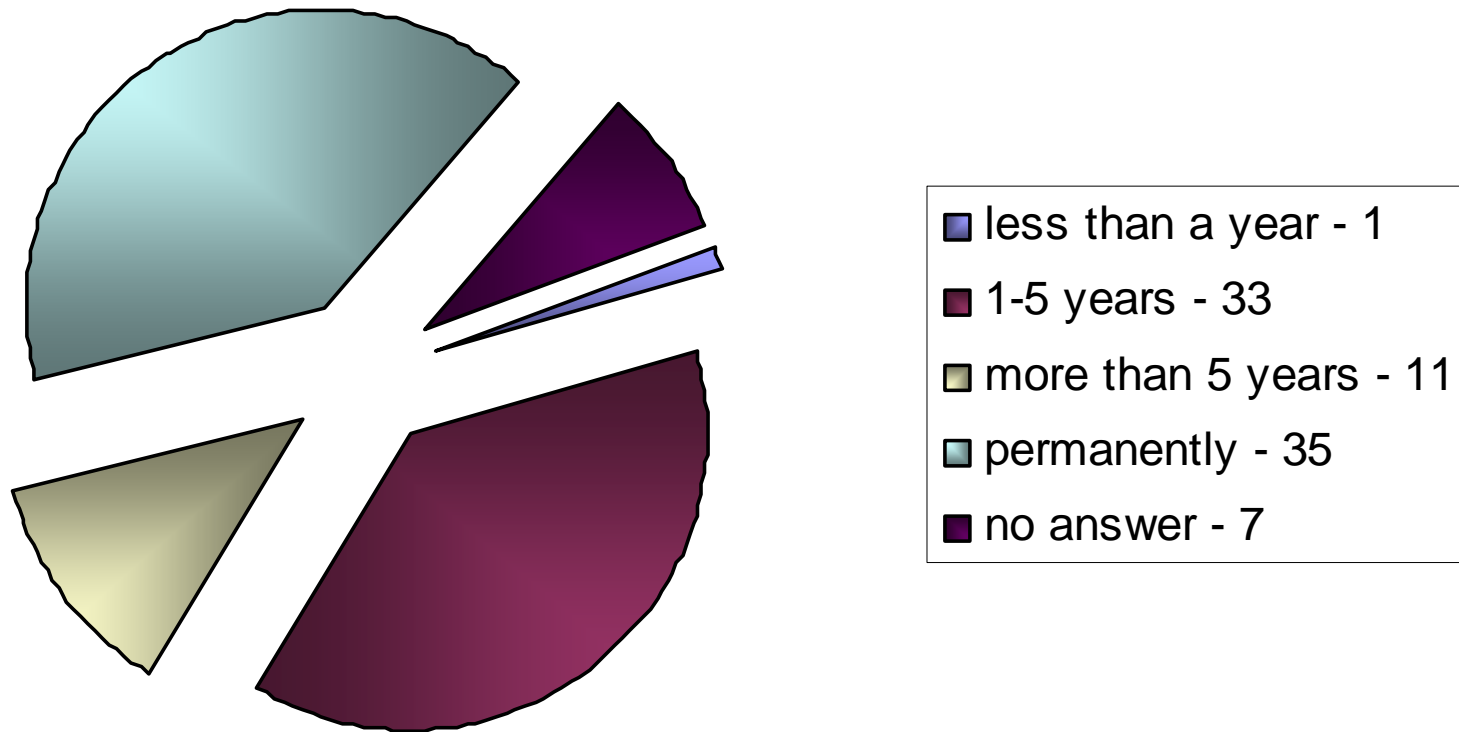

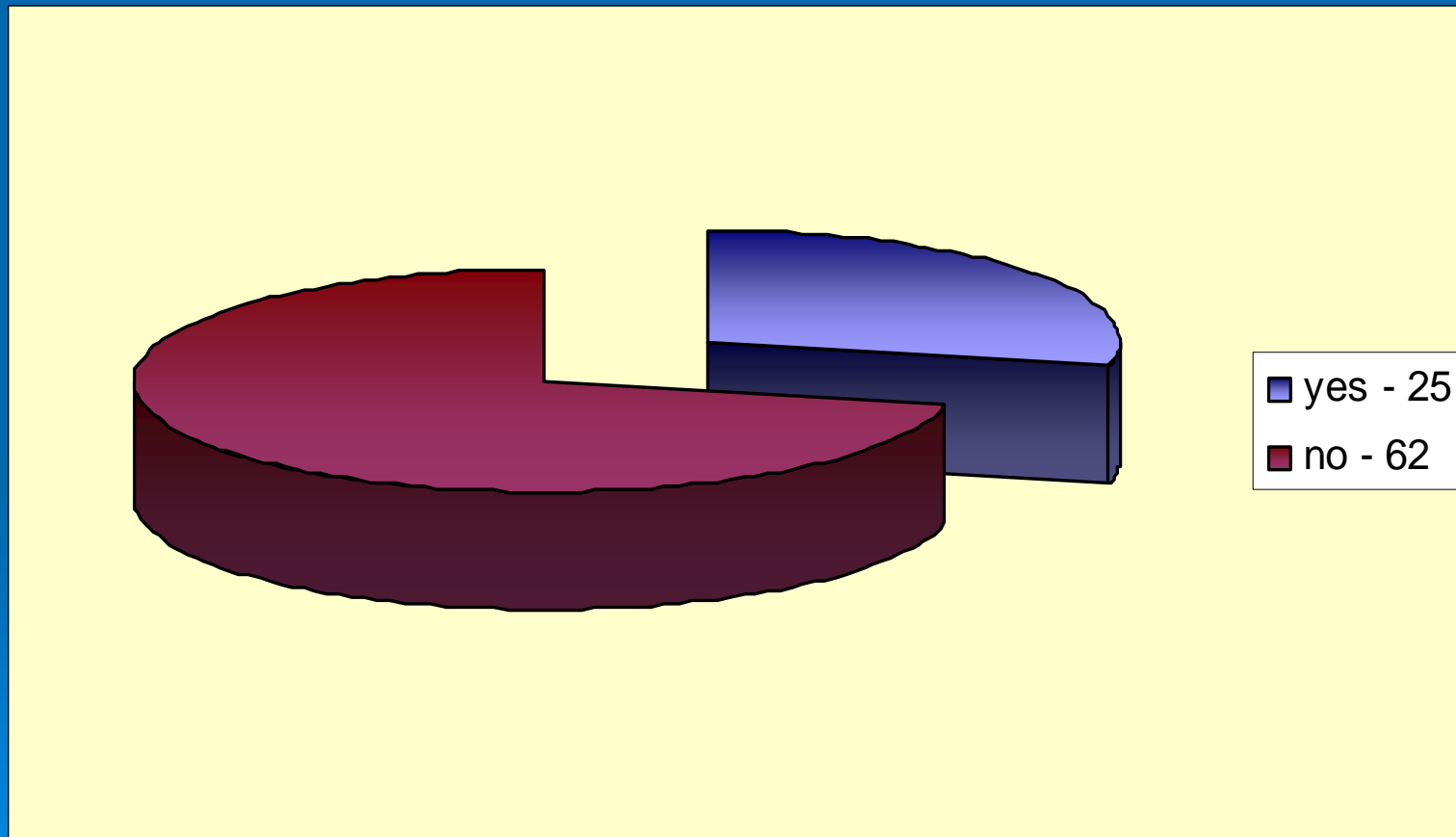


# Planned length of stay



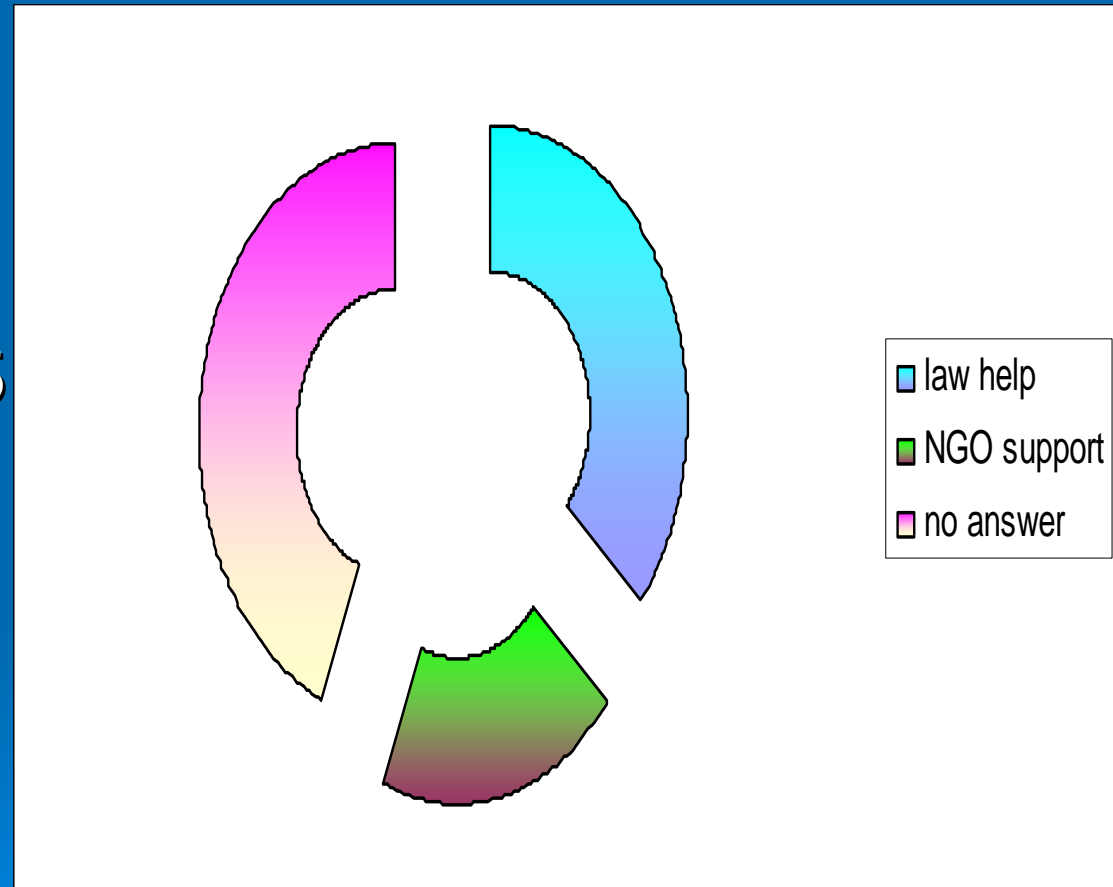

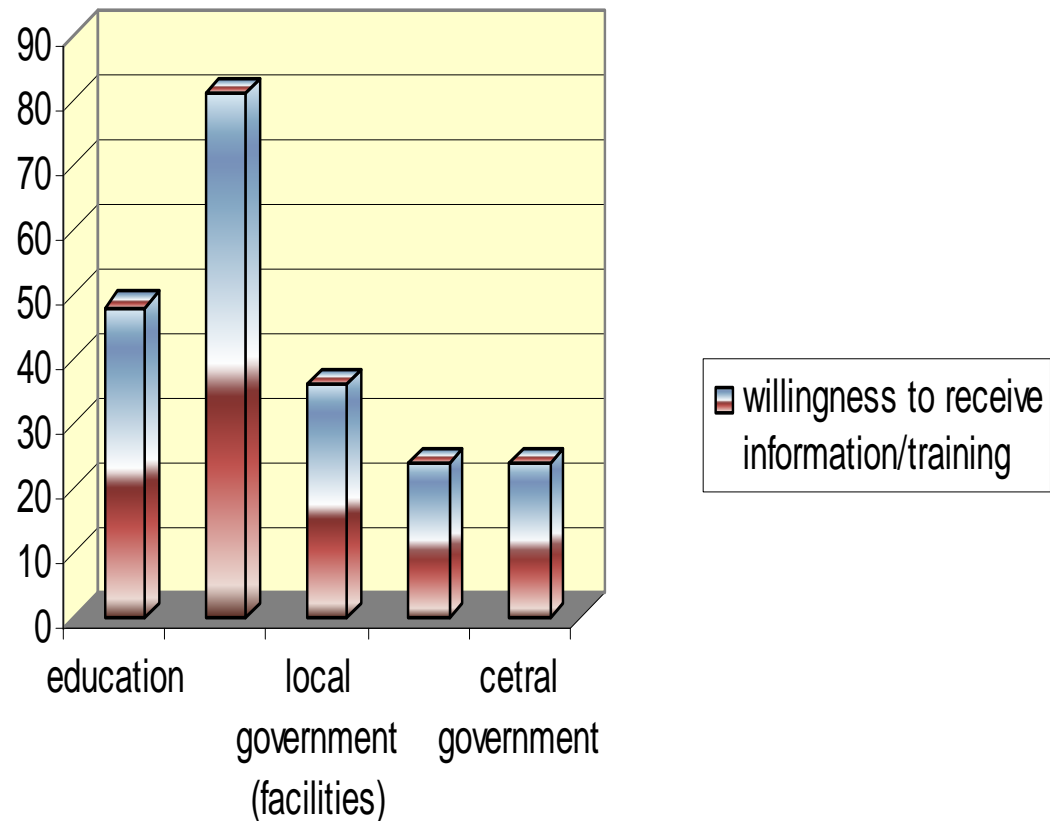

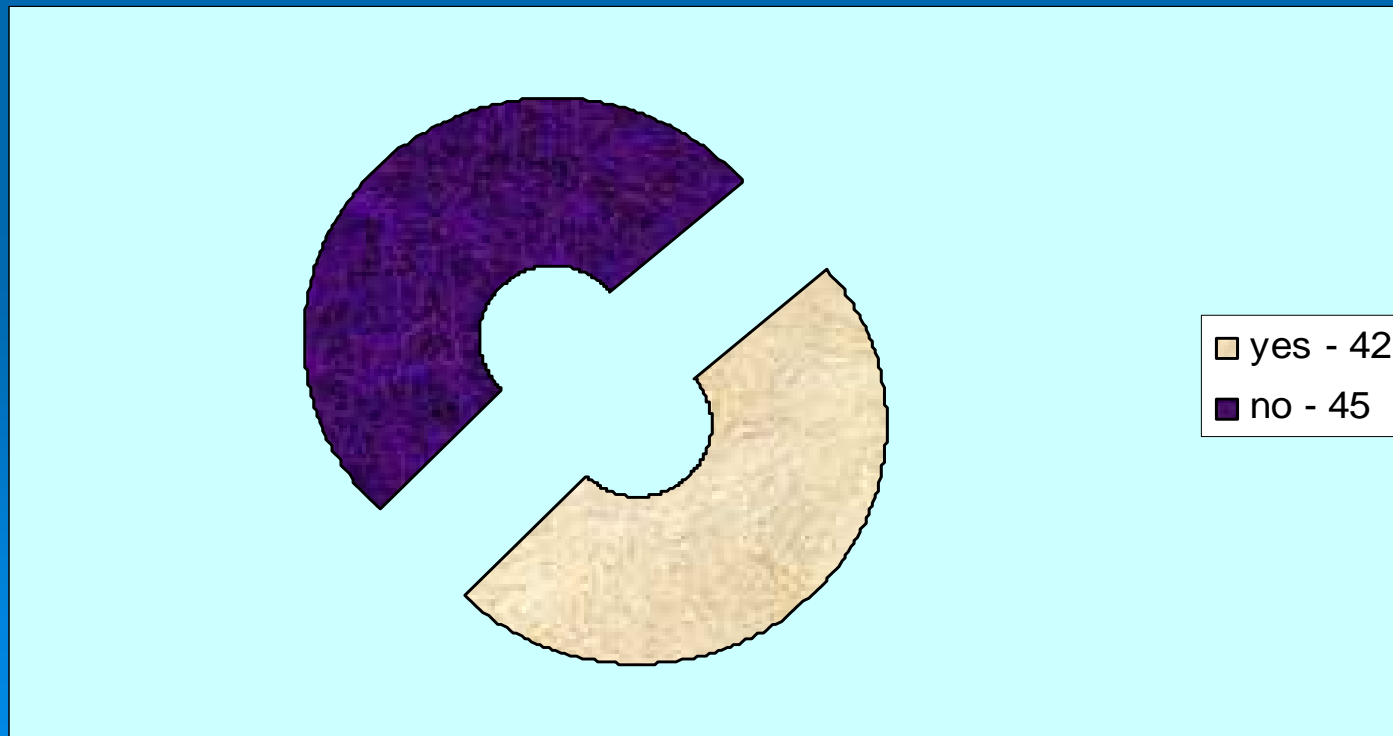


# Further education can help to become an active citizen - opinion

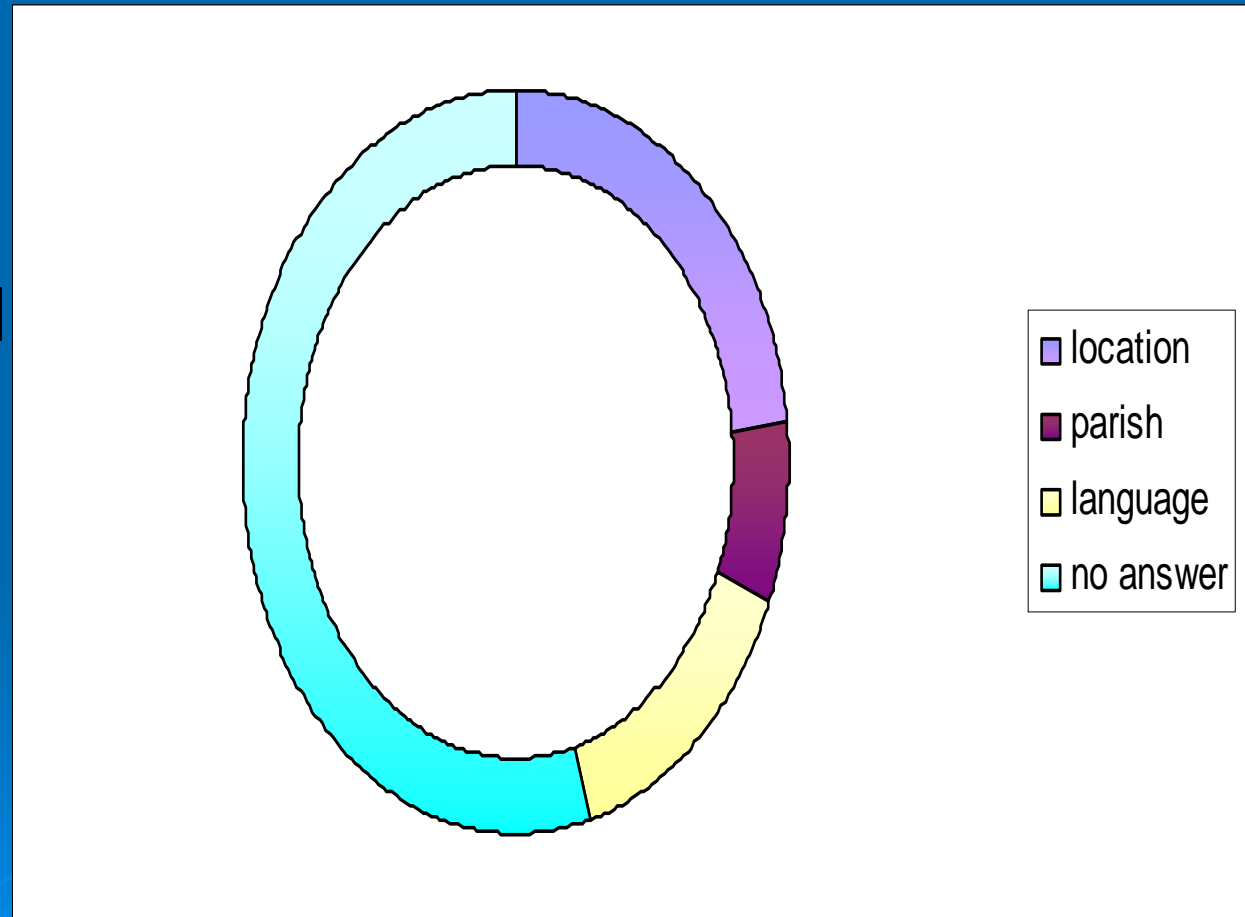


# Steps should be taken to promote greater participation in elections and other forms of civic engagement - view

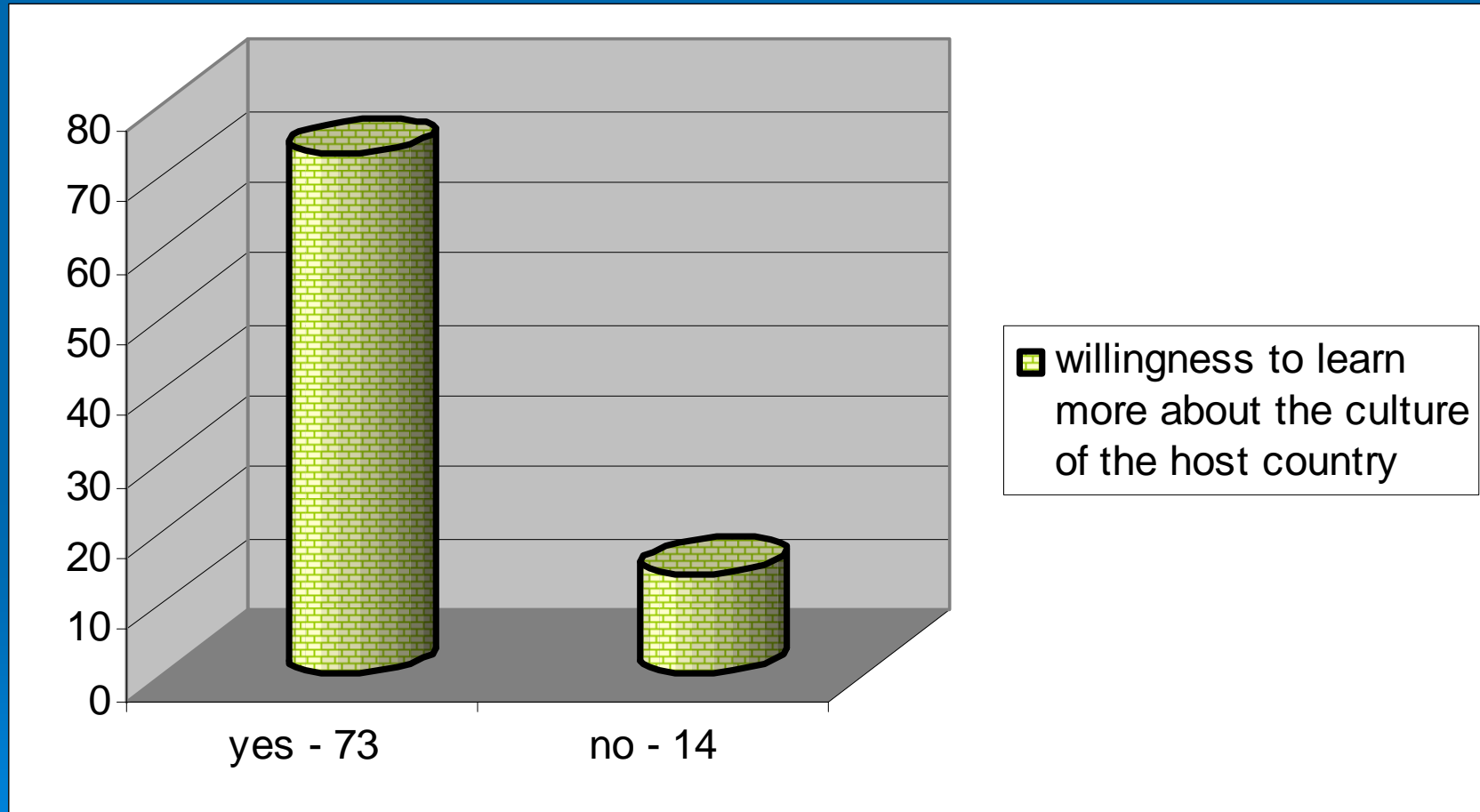

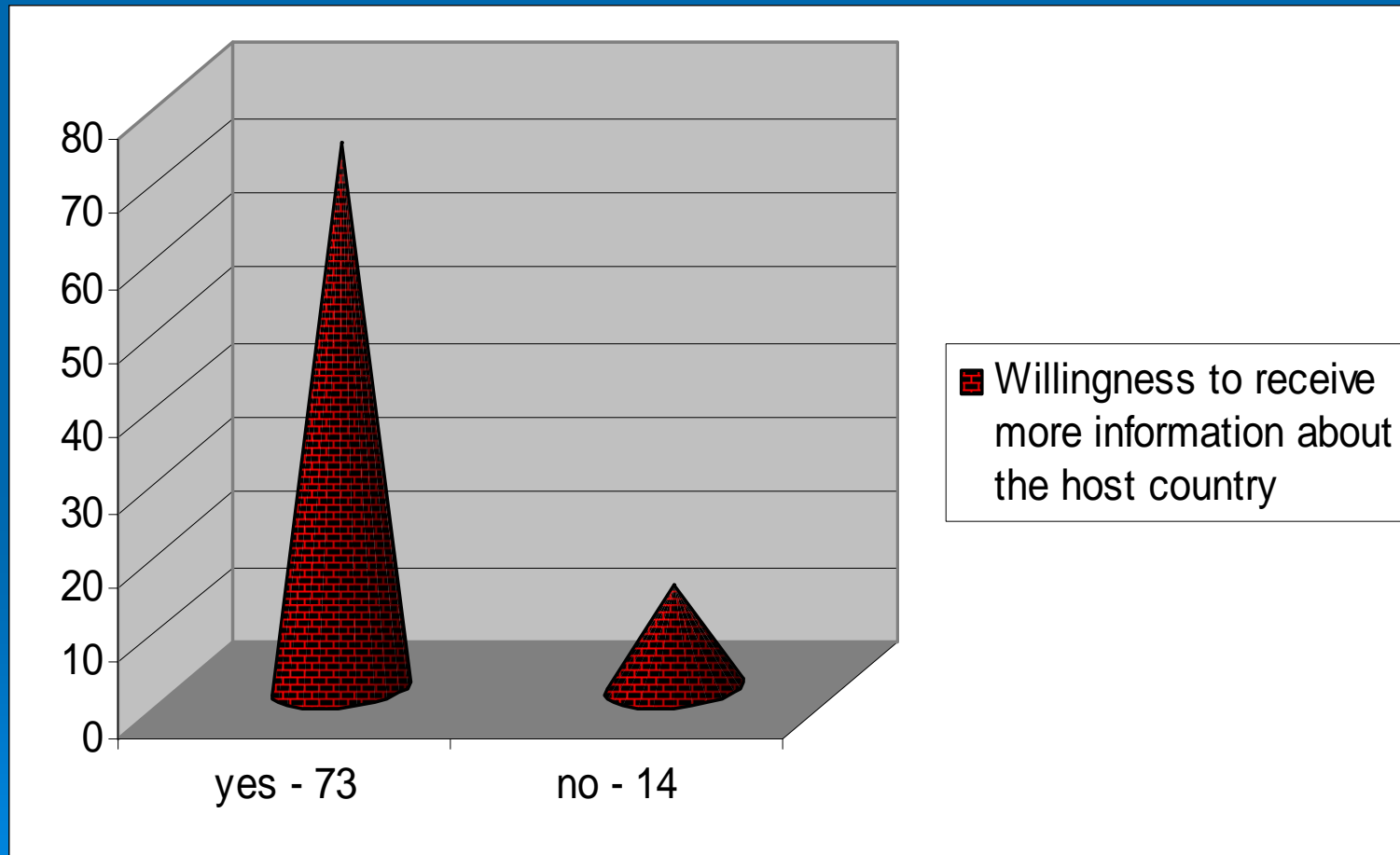

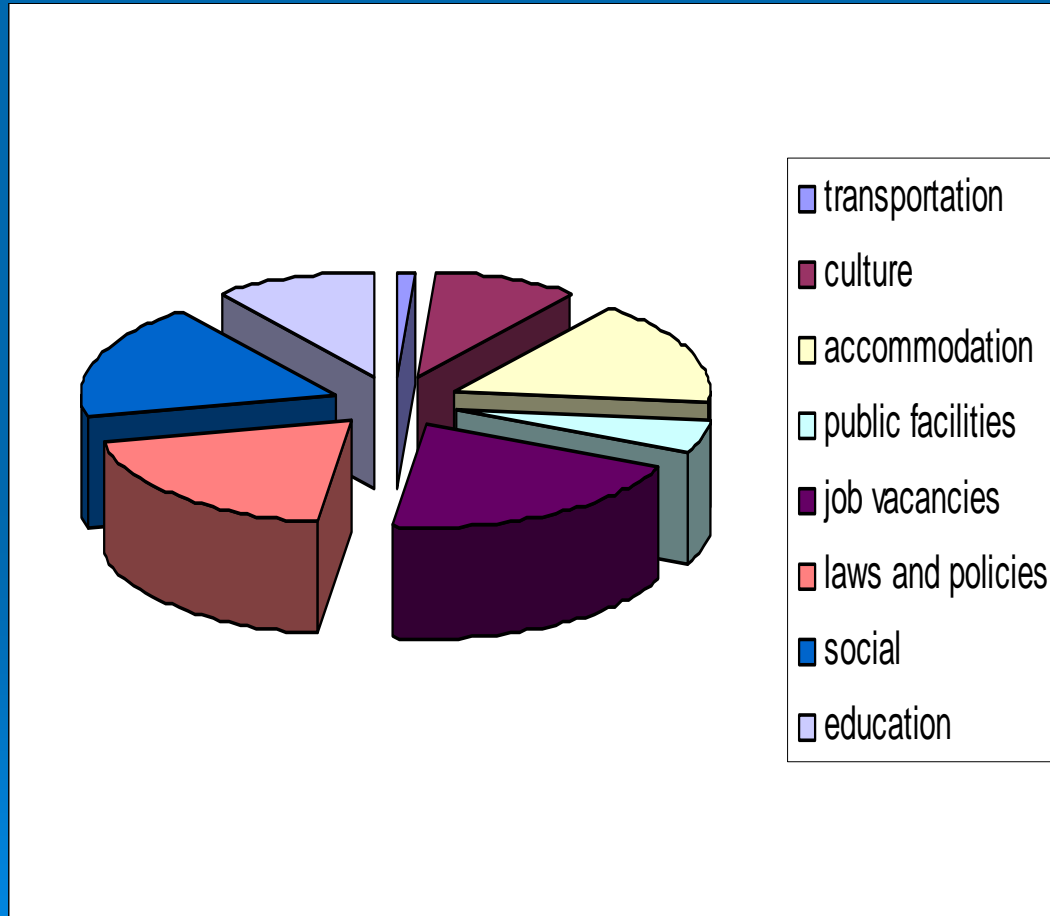

# Willingness to receive more information about the host country

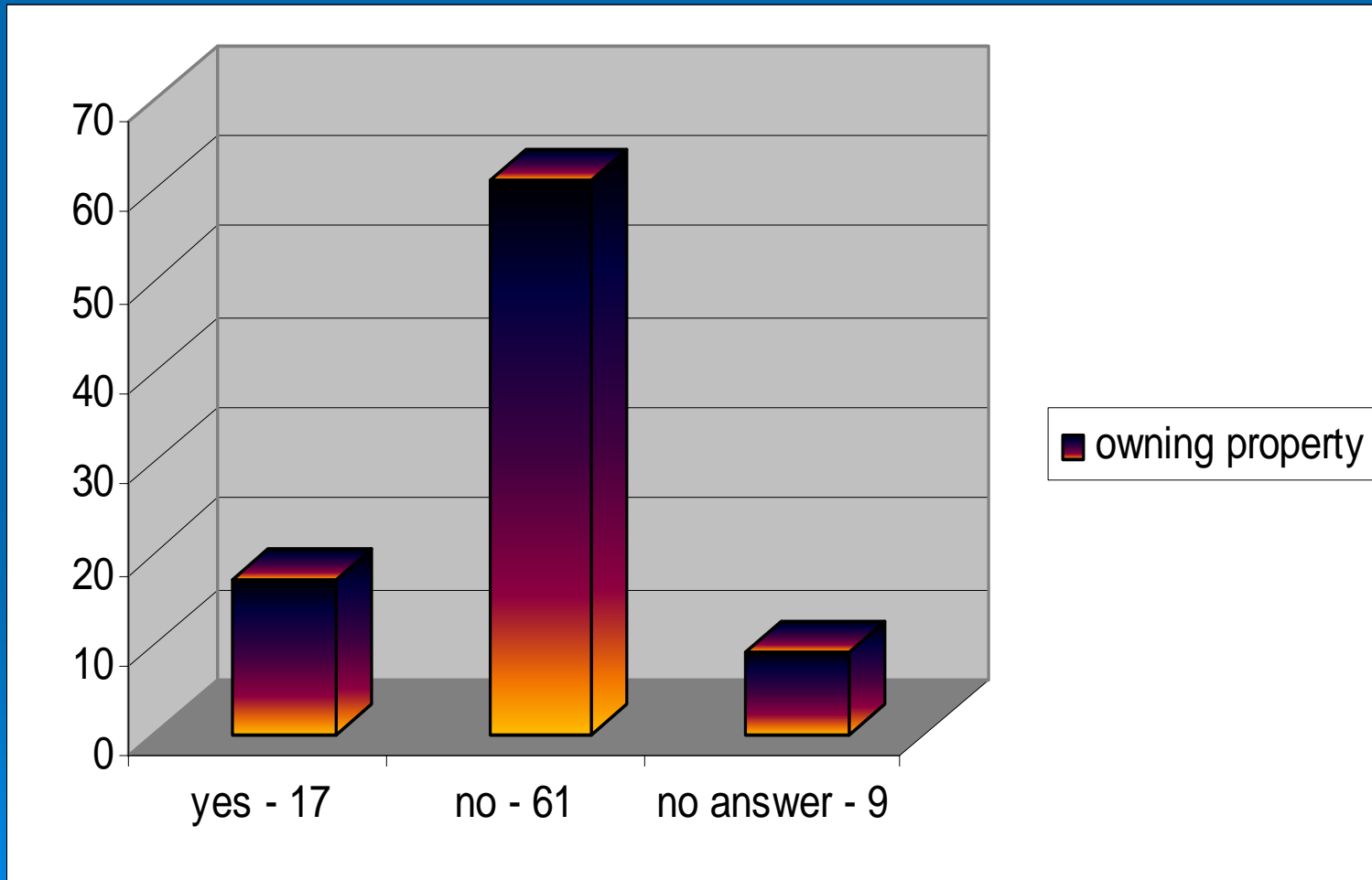

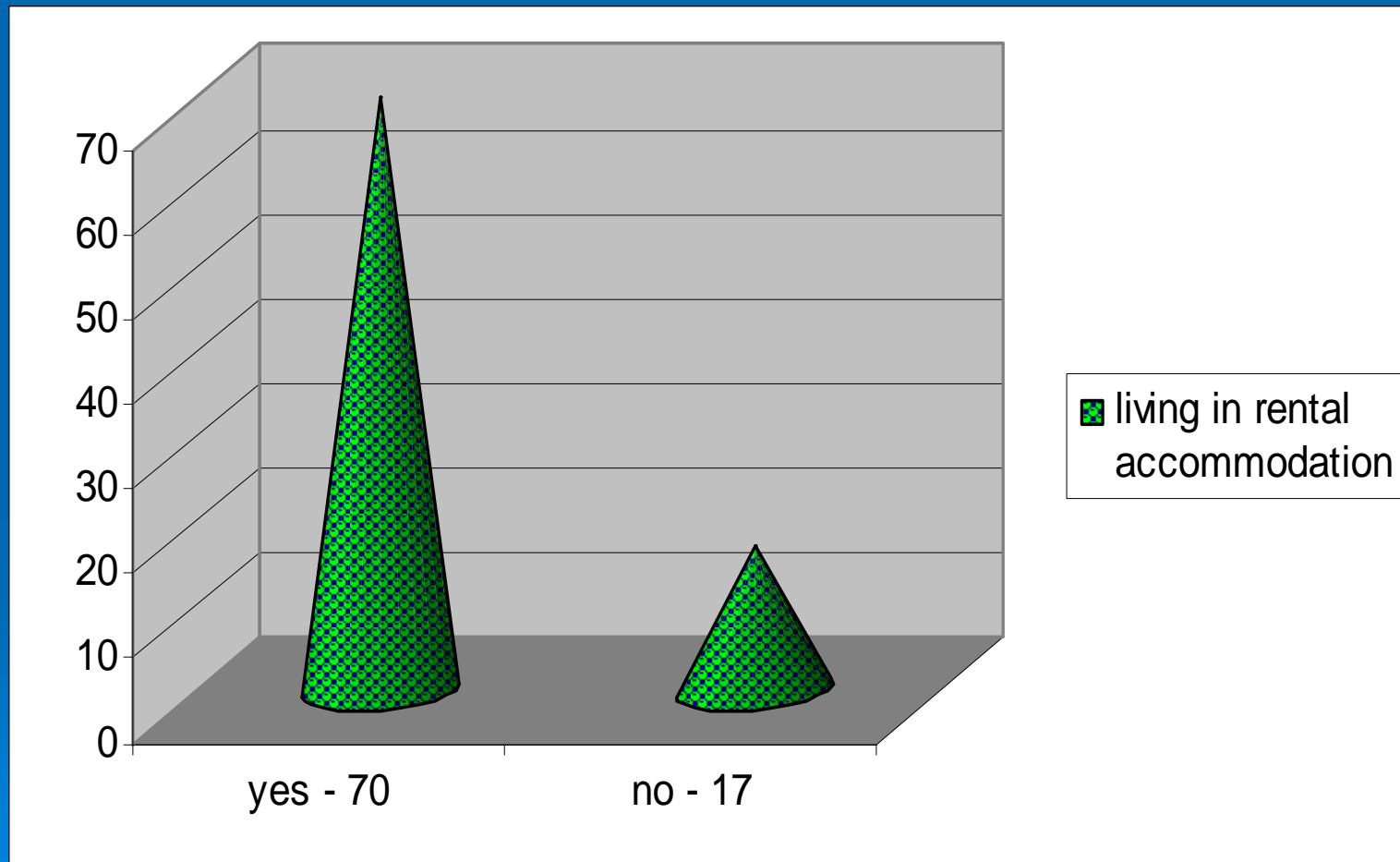

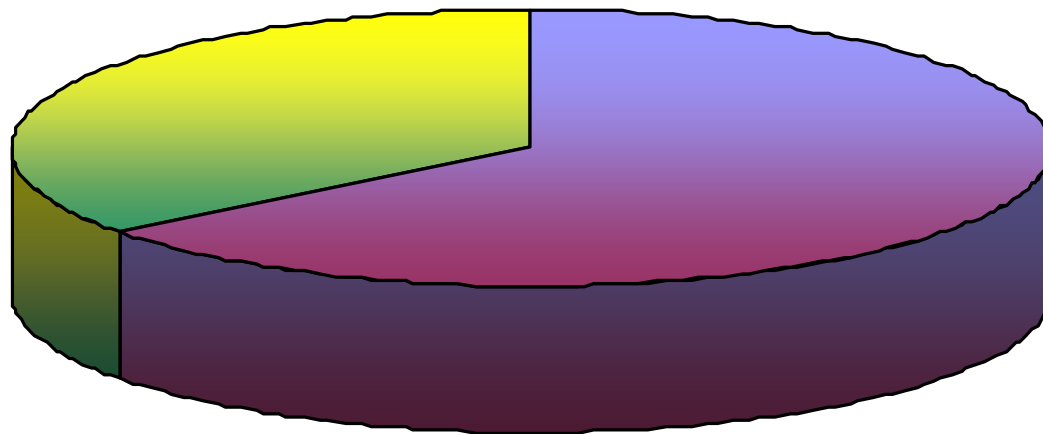
